Track and Trace Requirements for Delivery of Cannabis Goods

June 23, 2023

Addendum to Finding of Emergency

The Department hereby incorporates this addendum as part of the emergency readopt package. On June 16, 2023, the Department of Cannabis Control (Department) submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) an action to readopt its emergency regulations that implement track and trace requirements for cannabis goods carried by retail delivery employees pursuant to Business and Professions Code (BPC) sections 26067 and 26068.

The Department intended to readopt its present emergency regulations that were approved by OAL on December 27, 2022. However, during the five working-day public notice of the readopt action, the Department inadvertently noticed an incorrect version of the regulation text. The Department also mistakenly filed this incorrect version with OAL on June 16, 2023. Upon discovery of the error, the Department provided the correct version to OAL.

The impact of this error is not substantial; the Department intends to readopt the emergency regulations that were previously approved in December 2022. The version that will be readopted is the same regulation that Department licensees have been complying with for the last six months. Additionally, the Department has initiated a 45-day public notice that ends in July 2023 to permanently adopt the emergency regulations. Notwithstanding minor, technical edits, the regulation text currently open for public comment is identical to the emergency regulation text approved in December 2022 and proposed for readoption.
