Hello Cannabis Advisory Committee!

My name is Wayne Bishop. I am the CEO of 7 Points, a medium indoor cultivator and non-store front dispensary operator in the central valley.

I would like to bring to your attention the regulations stating that a limit of \$10k of retail sales inventory per vehicle is dramatically hampering our ability to run a profitable business. We delivery cannabis products from our Woodlake facility to Fresno and Bakersfield. This is a 70 mile radius.

This retail limit of product we can carry, is forcing us to run multiple vehicles and double shifts to and from these locations to service our customers. At a minimum, we would appreciate the Cannabis Advisory Committee to reconsider raising the limit of product per vehicle from \$10k to \$20k. This would allow us to run one vehicle per route and dramatically reduce our operational expenses and allow us to obtain a profitable business, which we are not at the moment and due to this limiting regulation.

We see no additional risk to our delivery drivers and to the safety of the public from allowing us to operate with \$20k of inventory per vehicle. We urge you to consider raising the limit of inventory from \$10k to \$20k by the end of this quarter.
