23	16. On or about April 8, 2022, the Department issued Adult-Use Distributor License
24	Number C11-0001513-LIC to Sabzi Hill, Inc. (Respondent) with Rami Kashani as Owner.
25	Respondent was required to identify and designate an owner of its commercial cannabis business
26	as the track and trace system account manager. The designated account manager was required to
27	complete the credentialing process to establish a login within ten (10) calendar days of the license
28	issue date, or by April 18, 2022.
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1	17. On September 2, 2022, a Department representative emailed a California Cannabis
2	Track and Trace System (CCTT) Reminder to Owner Rami Kashani's designated email account.
3	In that email, Owner Kashani was identified as the account manager for Respondent's Adult-Use
4	Distributor License and was given notice to immediately complete the mandatory credentialing
5	process, complete new user training, and email METRC to request access to the CCTT system.
6	In the September 2, 2022 email, Owner Kashani was notified that engaging in commercial
7	cannabis activity prior to completing these requirements may result in disciplinary action against
