2024 Annual Report

Introduction

The Cannabis Advisory Committee (CAC) was established under California state law (Business and Professions Code Section 26014) to advise the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) on the development of standards and regulations for commercial cannabis businesses, including those necessary to protect public health and safety.

The CAC engages in thoughtful, comprehensive discussion and provides an important venue for robust public input. This work supports DCC's mission of advancing and facilitating a well-regulated, legal market that benefits all Californians and vision for a safe, sustainable, and equitable cannabis market that serves as an example for the world.

CAC Recommendations

The CAC is required by <u>state law</u> to publish an annual report describing its activities, including the recommendations the CAC made to DCC and whether those recommendations were implemented by DCC.

The CAC held multiple meetings of the full committee membership during 2024 (March 7, June 6, September 19, November 21, and December 18). In between the quarterly meetings, various subcommittees met and held discussions to develop recommendations for consideration by the full committee.

In August 2024, the terms of most of the committee members expired. New committee members were appointed and held the first meeting in September 2024. This report includes the recommendations made by both committees.

In 2024, the prior full committee made the following recommendations to DCC:

Recommendations Related to Laboratories

Recommendation: Remove the requirement to run the initial extract, or remove dual dilution method.

Status: DCC continues to work on updates to the laboratory regulations, and this recommendation will be considered as part of that development process.



Recommendation: Adjust the LCS requirement to not include every analyte, or move to matrix post dilution spike.

Status: DCC continues to work on updates to the laboratory regulations, and this recommendation will be considered as part of that development process.

Recommendation: Increase the min sample weight to 500 mg, and include an acceptable range (rather than exact number).

Status: DCC continues to work on updates to the laboratory regulations, and this recommendation will be considered as part of that development process.

Recommendation: Set an equivalency criteria so that labs may use their own methods while honoring the intent of SB 544.

Status: DCC continues to work on updates to the laboratory regulations, and this recommendation will be considered as part of that development process.

Recommendations Related to Temporary Events

Recommendation: The DCC shall create a task force, comprised of regulators from local jurisdictions (cities/counties), cannabis event organizers, and DCC policymakers, with a goal to create a streamlined pilot project or working model with the participating counties and jurisdictions to facilitate temporary cannabis events.

Status: DCC will consider this recommendation when developing regulatory changes related to temporary cannabis events.

The new full committee made the following recommendations to DCC:

Recommendations Related to the California Cannabis Track and Trace System

Recommendation: Strike from the proposed regulatory updates under section 15049.1(b)(5)(A)-(F).

Status: DCC reassessed the proposed regulatory language in response to this recommendation.
