Animal Cannabis Product Standards

Chapter 1. All Licensees

Article 1. Division Definitions and General Requirements

§ 15000. Definitions.

(a) [...]

(w) “Edible cannabis product” has the meaning stated in section 26001(y) of the Act means a cannabis product intended to be used orally, in whole or in part, for human consumption. For purposes of this division, “edible cannabis products” are intended to be consumed orally and includes cannabis products that dissolve or disintegrate in the mouth, but does not include any products otherwise defined as “cannabis concentrates.”

Chapter 10. Cannabis and Cannabis Products

Article 4. Animal Cannabis Products

§ 17350. Animal Cannabis Product Standards.

(a) “Animal cannabis product” means a cannabis product intended for use on or consumption by an animal, as defined in BPC section 26001(c).

(b) Except as provided in this section, animal cannabis products are subject to the same requirements that apply to cannabis products under the Act and this division.

(c) Only the following types of products may be manufactured, distributed, or sold as animal cannabis products:

(1) Edible cannabis products;

(2) Orally consumed concentrates; and

(3) Topical cannabis products.

(d) An animal cannabis product may not contain more than one milligram of Total THC per package.
