## Discussion Topic: Combined Activities License (CAL)

<u>Senate Bill 1064</u> established a new license type, the combined activities license, which allows a business to conduct two or more commercial cannabis activities under a single license at the same premises, excluding laboratory testing.

The Department is in the process of defining the CAL and is seeking input.

#### **CAL Activities**

The Department is considering creating a specific list of qualifying activities:

## **Distribution**

- Full (Testing)
- Transport-Only + Storage Services
- Transport-Only (Self-Distro)

#### Retail

- Storefront + Delivery
- Delivery Only
- Event Only Retail

Businesses may select the required two activities from the same category or different categories (cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, or retail).

"Transport-only (self-distro)" and "event only retail" must be paired with at least one of the asterisked (\*) production activities.

### **Discussion Questions**

- Are there any additional activities that should be included, or any listed activities that should be removed?
- Are there any activity combinations that should be prohibited?
- Should CALs be limited in the total number of activities they conduct?
- If a CAL includes cultivation, how should canopy size be defined (e.g., mirror existing license sizes, create new size tiers, by square footage)?
- Should there be premises-related or other requirements specific to a CAL?
